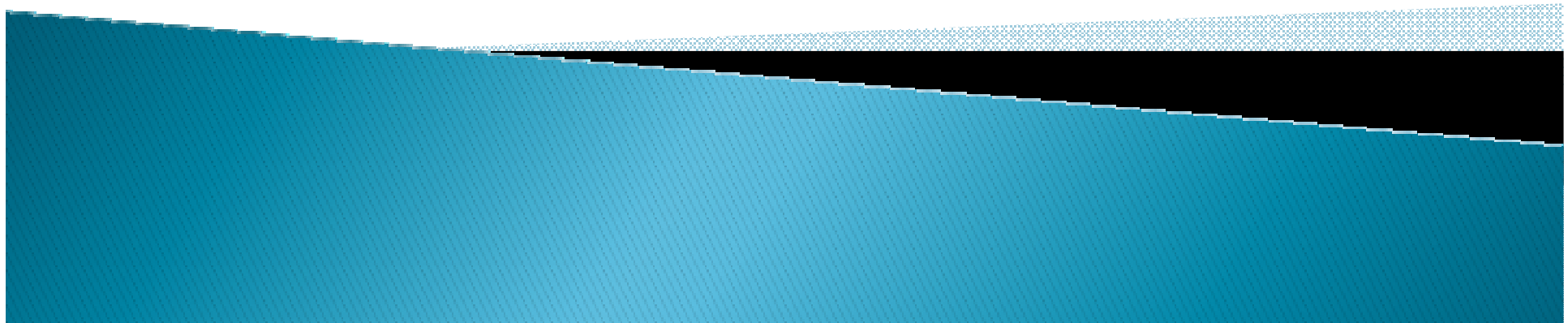

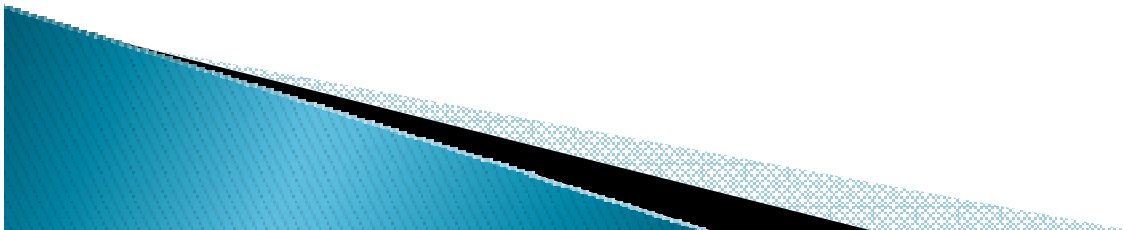

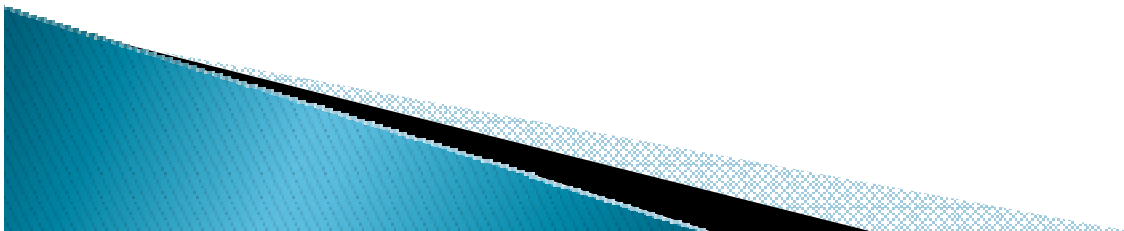

- ▶ The school library



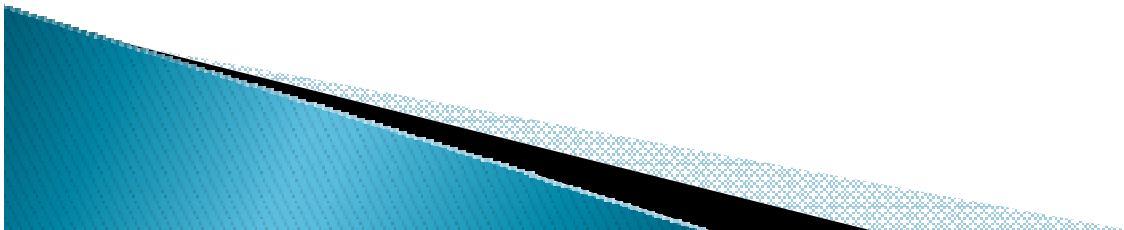


Academic Expectations...

Work at 'A–C' grade in AS Levels

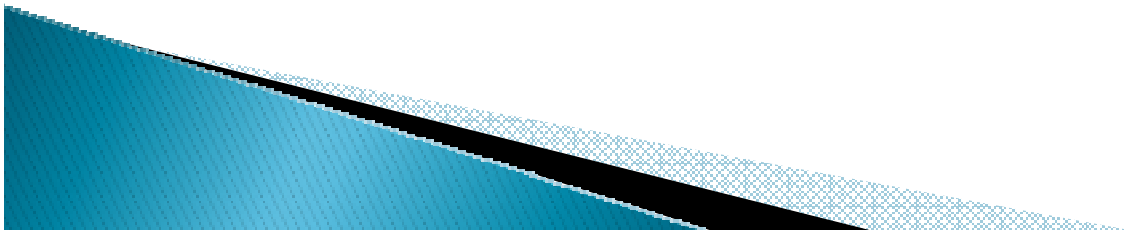
If effort grades are lacking and/or academic grades are at 'E' or 'U' then the place in the 6th Form is at serious risk

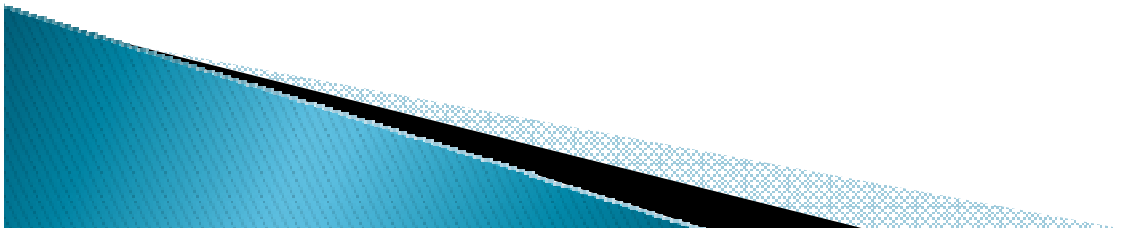


Student financial support...

- ▶ 'The 16–19 Bursary Scheme' is open to you if you are:
- ▶ A student in care or if you have been in care, if you are in receipt of income support or a disabled young people in receipt of certain government allowances. If this is you, then you will be eligible to receive a bursary of £1,200 a year.
- ▶ A student who in Year 11 was in receipt of free school meals, or is entitled to receive free school meals in Year 12. If this is you, then you will receive financial help to pay for travelling costs to school (up to £280) and to pay for any books not provided by the school.

Continued receipt of the Bursary will be dependent on regular attendance and compliance with the School's Code of Good Conduct.

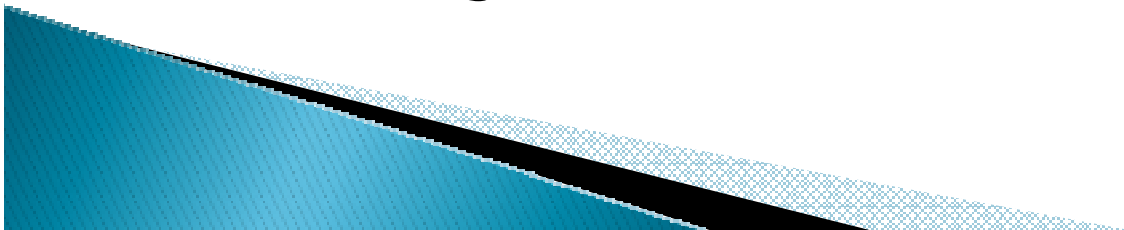




Expectations...

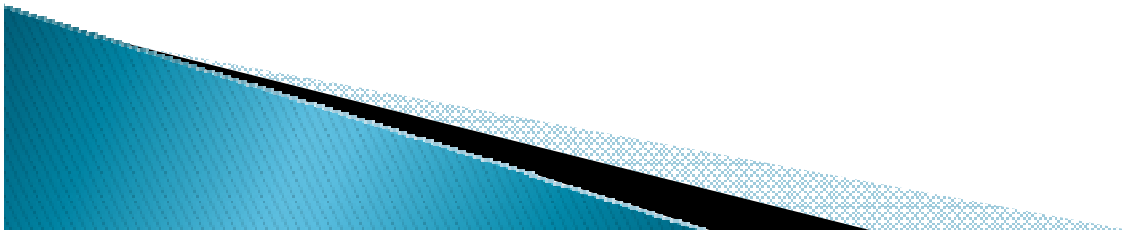

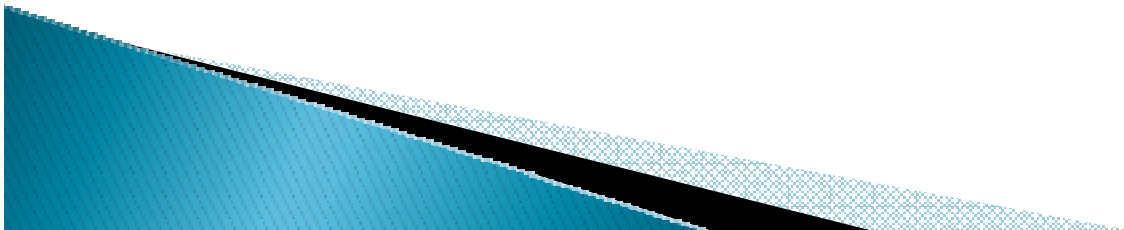
Assessment...

- ▶ Predicted grades

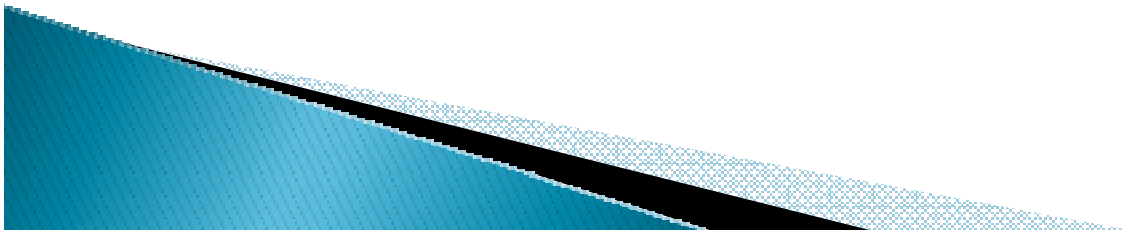

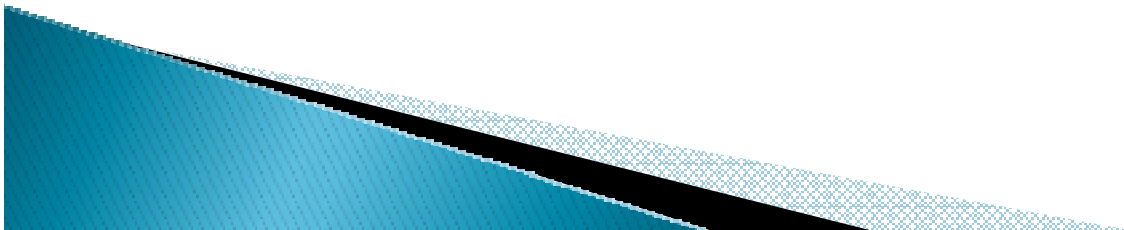

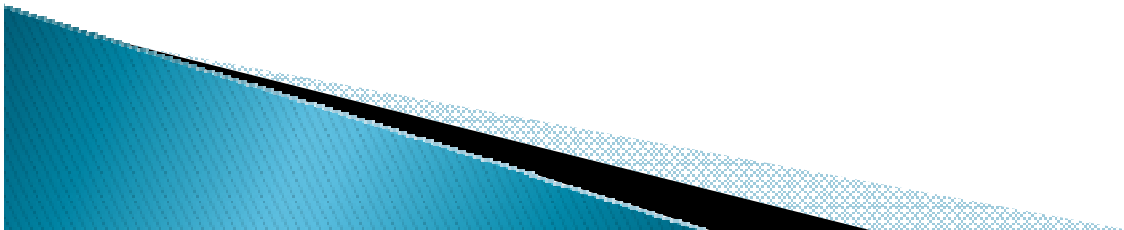
