**Re: Year 13 mock examination results**

Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s)

We are writing to inform you that are now able to view your son/daughter's recent mock examination results via the Go 4 School's system.

Once you are logged into Go 4 Schools, you will need to 'scroll down' towards the bottom of the page, where you will find a section entitled 'Reports'; the mock examination report can be found there – dated 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022. For each A Level mock examination you will see a grade:

Grade range from A\* (highest) to an E grade (lowest)

A U grade denotes a 'fail' – that the marks were too low to award a grade.

Due to the way Go4Schools works, some of the grades may appear with a small letter, such as an 'a, b or c' after them – please disregard this second smaller letter, if it appears.

The past 18 months have been a rollercoaster for all students, academically and socially and these mock examinations provide an up-to-date indication of current progress.

With the A Level examinations a little over 8 weeks away, it is critical that your son/daughter acts on the feedback they are given to put in place a robust plan to ensure success this summer. All students have received a motivational study-skills session with 'Maximise Your Potential' today; we hope this provides them with a timely boost and renewed focus for the coming weeks.

In particular, we would now ask all students to:

- Reflect on the importance of the next two-week period – students obviously need a rest, but it is also an important period in terms of preparation.
- Carefully consider the impact that part time employment can have at this time; we recommend no more than 8 hours a week of paid employment. We would strongly recommend that during the examination period (May/June) students are not working in paid employment, where possible.
- Devise a clear 'plan of attack' for the examinations; in the form of a study/revision timetable
- Continue to maintain a healthy balance; of school work, socialising and other activities such as sport/drama/music
- Ask for help and support, where needed, either from subject teachers or the 6<sup>th</sup> Form Pastoral Team
