You want to become a professional musician in the future.

## Our Syllabus

Board: Eduqas

Duration: 2 year course

Assessment: Combination of listening exam (40%) and coursework - performing and composing (60%)

Areas of Studies: Western Classical Music, Musicals and into the 20th Century (1900's+)


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EXAM 40%: listening exam at the end of Year I3. Includes short, multiple choice questions, open ended answers and long form essays. There will also be questions on context and culture. In preparation, you will study in depth the areas of study, analyse and contextualise music. Areas of Study: Western Classical Music and the development of the symphony, Into the 20th Century Classical music, and finally Musicals. You will study these three areas of study over the two year course.

COURSEWORK 60%: (PERFORMANCE/COMPOSITION)
you can choose one of two different routes into the coursework

ROUTE A: 35% Performance, 25% Composition (2 compositions)

OR

ROUTE B: 25% Performance, 35% Composition (3 compositions)

You get to choose whether you are stronger in performance or composing, and select the route that is right for you - which we think is GREAT!




