You have caught a man who has planted bombs across the city of London. He will not reveal the location of the bombs in the interrogation room. Your colleague has suggested torture.	<ul> <li>a) not torture him? To torture the man would be to go against Human Rights. Human Rights prohibit us from committing heinous acts.</li> <li>b) torture him? You're certain he'll give you the answer and who knows you could save hundreds of Londoners!</li> <li>c) not torture him? You regularly come across situations were criminals refuse to give you information. If you torture him, why not torture other criminals? What would this say about <i>you</i>?</li> </ul>
You witness a homeless man steal food and water from your local shop. You are standing next to the security guard who didn't notice.	<ul> <li>a) tell the truth? The act of stealing is illegal and it is your duty to do the right thing and tell the security guard the truth.</li> <li>b) ignore it? If you tell the security guard what you saw you'll be late meeting your friends and you'd much rather be with them.</li> <li>c) ignore it?
