BEYOND 18 LAUNCH AND PARENT/CARER EVENT Monday 10th February: 6:30pm to 7:45pm

Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s)

It will soon be time for your son/daughter to start thinking about what they are going to do once 'A' level studies are finished. To help students through this next round of decision-making, we have arranged for the year group to have a day to reflect and learn about the opportunities that are available to them.

Throughout Monday 10th February, students will gain advice on the process of applying to university and the options open to them in the world of work. This is an invaluable opportunity for them and will put them in a better position to make educated choices over the next 18 months. We will then have another in-depth day in late June with an additional Beyond 18 Day.

We would also like to invite you to a set of evening presentations. These will ensure that you are best placed to support your son/daughter in the decisions they will be making over the coming months. Please note that we are not able to accommodate students for the evening talk, as they will have received much of the same information during the day, however we can accommodate two adults per year 12 student.

The evening (10th February) will start at 6:30pm in the Main Theatre (above reception). The provisional agenda for the evening is as follows:

The evening promises to be very informative and I do hope you will make time to come along.

We also wanted to take the opportunity to sign-post some invaluable resources to you. We would strongly encourage you to take some time to review these as they are useful in supporting conversations that you will be having at home about possible future pathways. Your son/daughter will be receiving hard copies of many of these resources:





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- PIXL 'Getting into Top Universities' resource and PIXL Reading Lists although dated 2019-20 these
 are excellent resources. We will be using them in tutor time, with your son/daughter in the run up to
 the internal examinations. If your son/daughter is looking to apply to university, then they should be
 taking on board the advice in this publication.
- Rate My Apprenticeship 100: 100 top employers for school leaver apprenticeship programmes. This resource provides a superb overview of the myriad of employment opportunities available with some of the top UK and international companies.
- <u>UCAS Parents' Guide</u> a brilliant guide about the university application process. Please note that this
 guide hasn't yet been updated for your son/daughter's application cycle and that the dates will
 obviously change. A new guide should be available online soon.

The 'Beyond 18' Pathways

As part of the launch of 'Beyond 18' all students in year 12 must 'virtually' sign up to <u>at least one</u> of the following 'online pathways':

'University'
 'Job-Seeking'
 Delivered by Mr Bell and Mr Teece
 Delivered by Mrs King and Mrs Palmer

• 'Oxbridge' Delivered by Miss Smith

'Medics, Dentists and Vets'
 Delivered by Mr Bell, Mrs King and Mrs Palmer

These four new 'Google Classrooms' have been created, representing the four most in-demand Beyond 18 pathways. Your son/daughter will be asked to join the Google Classrooms, related to the pathways that they are interested in pursuing. All this information will be shared with them on 10^{th} February. It will be via these Google Classrooms that we look to deliver our programme of support, resources and information over the coming 6 months; it is therefore of the utmost importance that your son/daughter signs up to at least one pathway by Tuesday 4^{th} March – at the very latest.

Some students may be joining two, or even three pathways depending on what their future aspirations are. We recommend that students keep their options open as long as possible and therefore consider joining both 'University' and 'Job-seeking'. These Google Classrooms will enable us to streamline our communications and make them more directly relevant to your son/daughter's aspirations. Additionally, if you have signed up to 'Google Guardian' then you will be able to see the information that is posted on a weekly basis. The existing Year 12 Google Classroom will therefore only be used for pastoral purposes moving forward.





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Upcoming information:

In June, we will go into more detail with your son/daughter about how to apply to university, with our second 'Beyond 18 Day' which takes place on Monday 30th June. This will include: practical sessions on writing CVs and Personal Statements, start-up sessions on the UCAS online process (for those applying to university) and a range of focus sessions allowing your son/daughter to find out more about different career paths and subject areas. This day is also important as it provides Form Tutors with information for the reference which the school will provide universities/employers in academic year 2025-26. It is extremely important that your son/daughter is in school on Monday 30th June.

This will be preceded on Thursday 5th June with a University Open Day when we take all students to visit a university campus in London/Essex. This event includes: representatives from a range of universities, the opportunity to ask questions, find out about courses and job opportunities, living accommodation etc., talks on a range of topics including student finance, making applications etc.

Following the 30th June, we will be working throughout the first week in July, on supporting students with their university and job applications, in a series of bespoke sessions.

A final reminder...

As <u>previously communicated</u>, during the last week of the summer term (Monday 14th July – Friday 18th July) all students in Year 12 will be completing work shadowing. It is important that all students in Year 12 complete the work shadowing form so that the school is able to make contact with the placement employer. Any students who have failed to secure a work shadowing placement will spend the last week of term in July with the Sixth Form Pastoral Team. <u>link to the Google Form</u>
