Re: 'Beyond 18' Transition Activities

Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s)

Firstly, thank you once again for all your support over the past academic year.

Although your son/daughter is no longer attending school, we want to do all we can to continue to support them educationally; whether their final destination is university or the world of work.

In many cases, your son/daughter will now be looking forward to a long, and we hope, enjoyable summer ahead before they commence either employment or study at university. In the interim we are signposting a range of activities that your son/daughter could engage with over the coming months to support their 'Beyond 18' transition.

For all students:

- <u>Virtual Work Experience</u> we recommend that your son/daughter continues to look for 'virtual' opportunities in order to broaden their skills. Mrs Palmer (Head of Careers) has shared these opportunities with students consistently this year.
- The <u>National Careers Service</u> has an excellent online platform with an intuitive filtering/search tool there are lots of free courses, as well as a mix of in-person/online learning opportunities.

During Year 12 and 13, we recommended that every student complete at least one MOOC (Massive Online Open Learning Course). MOOCs offer courses without the need to complete an entire programme of studies and are becoming increasingly popular. They offer a large number of students the opportunity to study high quality courses online with prestigious universities, often at no cost. They are ideal for independent study and users can select courses from any institution offering them. Video-based, they offer interaction either through peer review and group collaboration or automated feedback through objective, online assessments (including quizzes and exams). Your son/daughter may therefore be proactive and sign up for a MOOC if they are yet to complete one. 'FutureLearn' courses are the most widely utilised (www.futurelearn.com). Most (not every) course is free and for many you are only required to pay if you wish to download the certificate (which you do not need to!) Other possible MOOCs are:

- <u>Coursera</u> features 500+ courses, from more than 100 partners worldwide, including Duke University in the US.
- <u>Udemy</u> offers free and paid-for courses, many from non-academic instructors.
- <u>EdX</u> is a not-for-profit provider, created by Harvard and MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology) universities. Today partners include the Australian National University, TU Delft (the Netherlands), and





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 Rice, Berkeley and Georgetown universities in the US. EdX also offers ID verified certificates of achievement, for a minimum fee.

If you son/daughter is intending to continue with academic study at university, then we recommend the following:

- <u>Suggested Super-Curricular Activities:</u> This superb resource, directly from the University of Cambridge, is a list of suggested subject-specific activities to assist students in their transition to 30 different undergraduate courses.
- <u>Academic Study Skills Course:</u> Queen Mary: The University of London offer students a free academic study skills course which students can sign up to. The course teaches student how to become highly competent in the key skills needed for university.
- <u>Transitioning to university:</u> Your son/daughter's first year at University brings lots of changes, as well as exciting opportunities. This course will help you understand and prepare for your first few weeks at university, by delving deeper into the differences between school and university, and explaining some of the support services available.
- <u>Preparing for university:</u> This MOOC from the University of East Anglia covers an introduction to the key skills yours son/daughter will need for their studies at university, helping them to get ahead before they start their course.

We also suggesting that students could take some time to engage with their new degree courses on a wider level. There is a series of excellent video lectures by Gresham College – click here
